

**Dick Barrett
(1918-2012)**



I regret to inform the membership, who perhaps may not have heard, that a truly great fiddle player, and one of TOTFA's creators, has passed away at the age of 93. Mr. Barrett was without question one of the greatest fiddlers of all time, winning many titles at the State, National, and World Championship levels. However, it was a legacy that almost never happened. In my researching more about Mr. Barrett, I found a story about one of his very first fiddle teachers, the legendary Major Franklin. Mr. Barrett was already playing the fiddle, being influenced by his father and grandfather's fiddling at a young age, but his real passion at the age of 10 was baseball. That is, until one evening his brother, J.J. who played the guitar, brought Major to their home. That was his introduction to real Texas style breakdown fiddling. His father, Sam, asked Major if he could give Dick a few lessons. Well, after the second lesson, Major told Sam, "Save your money, that boy will never learn anything." Needless to say, that encounter in 1927 lit a fire in Mr. Barrett for a love of fiddle music that burned bright until his passing in February 2012. I encourage you younger musicians to learn more about him and listen to his recordings. There is plenty of information about him on the
